At this called meeting regarding the new town hall, it was agreed to meet at the original Town Hall to open the meeting and proceed as a group to the new town hall to make some final decisions.

Item1. Tile

At the new Town Hall, council discussed altering the plan to include tile on part of the walls for the restrooms. Council Member Presley made the motion to use the same tile for partial wall covering and floor. Council Member Dotterweich made the second, and the vote passed unanimously.

Item 2. Flooring

Council Member Carlson made the motion to extend the same laminate flooring from the community room into a storage area. Council Member Presley made the second, and the vote was unanimous.

Item 3. Wood Stain

Council Member Dotterweich made the motion to use the darker ebony stain for the doors. Council Member Carlson made the second, and the vote was unanimous.

Item 4. Trim

Council Member Presley made the motion to use the trim that was shown by the builder and to paint it white. The trim will be used in the community room, the back hall and conference room. Council Member Carlson made the second, and the vote was unanimous.

Item 5. Exterior Paint Colors

Council Member Presley made the motion to use the basic color “naturel” (and white trim) from the samples shown on the exterior of the building. Council Member Dotterweich made the second, and the vote was unanimous.

Council discussed furniture, bathroom windows, and outside trim. Council Member Dotterweich made the motion to adjourn the meeting, and Council Member Carlson made the second, and the vote was unanimous.
